Community

Mt. Olive High School is located in Mount Olive Township, a community approximately 45 miles west of New York City. The thirty-two square mile community forms part of the western boundary of Morris County. Residential suburban growth and industrial expansion characterize this changing northwestern New Jersey area. The combined population of the township is nearly 25,000. Mount Olive residents cross a broad spectrum of socio-economic levels. Most are college graduates. Mount Olive is a community strongly characterized by a spirit of volunteerism and community service. Community members generously offer their support in the educational programs and student activities at Mount Olive High School.

Curriculum

The college preparatory curriculum is designed to develop individual potential while meeting the entrance requirements of America's most competitive colleges. A fully diversified curriculum in college preparatory and standard subjects is offered in art, business, computer education, English, family and consumer science, mathematics, music, physical education, science, social studies, related arts, and world languages. Cooperative education and vocational-technical subjects are available in shared-time programs. A four-year honors sequence is offered in English, mathematics, science, social studies and world languages. For students with special educational needs, the school offers foundation courses in the academic areas as well as supportive instruction in learning and study skills. In September 2016, construction was completed on the Marauder Innovation Learning Lab (MILL). One of the highlights of the new space are thirty 3D printers making MOHS the only high school in the country to offer students such vast opportunities for creating. Principal Kevin Stansberry said, "There is no doubt that the MILL is a preeminent 21st century college and career readiness facility." The renovation also included a new sound studio with recording booths.

School

Mount Olive High School was established in 1972 when the community elected to de-regionalize from the West Morris School District and construct its own high school building. Mount Olive High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school. The high school is a member of the National Association of College Admissions Counselors and complies with the NACAC *Statement of Good Practice*. Mount Olive High School was named in the top 100 high schools in New Jersey by New Jersey Monthly Magazine since 2010. Our high school was also ranked 50th in New Jersey by US News & World Report. Recently, Niche ranked Mount Olive School District 38th in the state.

SAT Reasoning Test Scores

The scores below represent the rounded, mean results of 261 members of the class of 2018 or 75 percent of the class, 260 members of the class of 2017 or 72 percent of the class, and 270 members of the class of 2016 or 77 percent of the class. The accompanying chart is a depiction of the comparisons between the mean Critical Reading (CR), Mathematics (M) and Writing (W) scores for students from Mount Olive High School (MOHS), test-takers nationally (National) and students from the State of New Jersey (New Jersey). The results for 2017 & 2018 are for Evidence-Based Reading & Writing (ERW) and Math (M). The best scores of all class members who took the SAT are reported.

Calculation of Student Standing

At the conclusion of each quarter, a weighted grade point average that includes all subjects is computed for all students who have attended Mount Olive High School for at least five semesters. All marking period grades, mid-term and final exam (if given) are used in the computation, except where those grades are recorded as Pass/Fail, Medical Excuse (ME) or Audit (AU). Grades are transposed from alphabetical grades to the designated numerical grade equivalents. To calculate student standing, the total weighted grade points are divided by the number of grades issued. This calculation results in the weighted grade point average. Mount Olive High School does not release exact standing except for scholarship purposes. The accompanying chart depicts the range and number of class members in each decile grouping for the class of 2019 as of the conclusion of the 2017-2018 academic year.
